Greens present strategy on changing how we get around

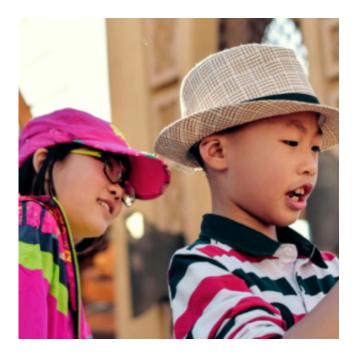

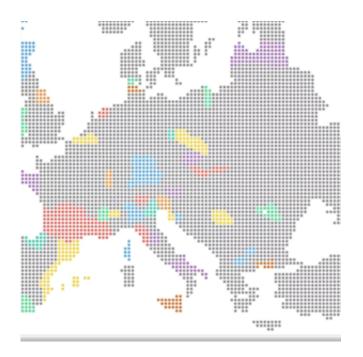
