Whistleblower protection in Europe

Greens/EFA roundtable

The need to protect whistleblowers is increasingly recognised at both international and national level, and the EU institutions are pushing forward on the issue:

- The European Commission has recently <u>launched a public consultation</u> on the issue of whistleblower protection and is <u>undertaking an</u> impact assessment to ascertain to what extent the EU might be able to legislate on the matter.
- The European Parliament recently adopted a <u>report by the Budgetary Control Committee</u> on the protection of whistleblowers and the Legal Affairs Committee is <u>about to draft a report</u> of its own.
- The Financial Affairs Council of the European Union has <u>called for EU action on the matter</u>, and the Justice and Home Affairs Council has whistleblower protection on its agenda for 27 and <u>28</u> March.

In this context, MEPs Pascal Durand, Benedek Jávor and Julia Reda are organising a high-level roundtable to gather together MEPs, Commission officials and representatives from various different sectors: Trade unions, NGOs, journalists' organisations, media publishers and business representatives.
