Instead of weakening competition law to create European Champions, the EU and national authorities need to strengthen their efforts to protect SMEs from unfair market practices and unnecessary regulatory burden.

"The Commission's SME strategy points to these challenges. However, it is only a first step to help transform European SMEs towards sustainable and competitive success. After all, none of these initiatives can have an impact if national governments deny sufficient funds for this transition in the MFF negotiations."
